

## **SAN MINIATO AND VOLTERRA**

## ROADBOOK

0,000 🕞	<b>Starting point</b> from Piazza del Popolo, <b>San Miniato.</b> Go along the street in the only direction possible and at the end of the square turn <b>right</b> towards " <b>Montaione</b> "
0,150	Turn <b>left</b> towards <b>"Montaione/Centro"</b> and after a few metres turn <b>left</b> again (give the right of way)
0,300 💿	At the <b>STOP</b> sign turn <b>right</b> and pass through the town of <b>San Miniato</b> . At km 0.700, at the crossroads, take the street on the left that leads out of town and continue towards <b>"Montaione"</b>
3,000	Turn <b>left</b> towards <b>Montaione</b> . Pass through the hill and the town of <b>Moriolo</b>
5,700 💿	At the <b>STOP</b> sign take the road turning <b>left</b> towards <b>"Corazzano"</b> and cross a flat area, with some old disused tobacco mills that evidence a recent past economic activity.  At Km 9.0 on the left there is the <b>Pieve di Corazzano</b> (Parish Church of Corazzano)
14,300	Keep to the right towards <b>"Sughera"</b> and pass the hamlet of <b>Alberi</b>
17,150	At the yield sign turn <b>left</b> towards <b>San Vivaldo</b> and continue along the street for a long road section that passes through a shady wood
22,450	At the end of the street, at the <b>STOP</b> sign, turn right taking the <b>SP26</b> road
23,550	Turn left towards San Vivaldo-Volterra
	Arrival at <b>San Vivaldo</b> . On the <b>left</b> there is a large parking area, we recommend a tour of the town! To continue the tour, turn <b>right</b> towards " <b>Villamagna</b> " and pass through the town of lano: at km 26.80, at the Church, continue keeping to the right on the road that descends and continue on the <b>SP13</b> – a long section of the road is unlevelled, but the discomfort is compensated by the beautiful panoramas. At Km 33.0, in <b>Villamagna</b> keep to the <b>right</b> . Then continue <b>straight ahead</b> towards <b>Volterra</b>
27,750 💿	At km 27.75 on the <b>left</b> there is a deviation for <b>Santuario della Pietrina</b> (at about a distance of 1 km, very narrow uphill street)
36,800	At the <b>STOP</b> sign turn <b>right</b> towards <b>Volterra</b>
37,150	At the yield sign turn <b>right</b> and go over the bridge

37,450 📀	Turn <b>left</b> towards <b>Volterra</b> and continue straight ahead on the <b>SP15</b> road. At about 42 Km, view of the crags, a particular geological formation on which <b>Volterra</b> is located, from a lower position. Continue and always follow the street that runs along the city walls
46,750	Petrol station at Km 46.75
46,550	Turn left, towards the "Centro"
47,200 •	Turn <b>left</b> . At km 47.80, arrival at <b>Volterra</b> in Piazza Martiri della Libertà. On the left of the square there is a motorcycle parking area. To continue the itinerary, go back over the same street until reaching the <b>STOP</b> sign
48,450	At the <b>STOP</b> sign turn <b>left</b> , and go along the <b>SR68</b> road
51,500 💿	Turn <b>left</b> towards <b>"Pisa/Villamagna"</b> , on the <b>SR 439</b> road Dir. At Km 55.80 on the right possible deviation for <b>Pieve della Nera</b> – a section of the street is a dirt road
61,550	Turn right towards Castelfiorentino. At Km 72.35 continue along the SP4 road towards Castelfiorentino-Gambassi
77,350	Turn left towards Montaione
79,200	Turn <b>left</b> towards <b>Montaione</b> . Continue <b>straight ahead</b> towards the <b>centre</b>
81,000 •	At the <b>STOP</b> sign turn <b>right</b> and you arrive in <b>Montaione</b> .  There is the possibility to park in the square and along the street.  To continue the tour, proceed along the street following the directions for <b>"San Miniato/Alberi"</b>
94,800	Turn right, towards "San Miniato" and pass the hill of Moriolo






100,000 Arrival in Piazza del Popolo in San Miniato

### SAN MINIATO AND VOLTERRA

The itinerary runs through two historical hamlets among the most interesting in the province of Pisa – the medieval hamlet of San Miniato, entirely located on a ridge between the Arno and Egola Valleys, and the city Volterra, of Etruscan origin – passing through panoramic countryside roads and charming landscapes. Along the itinerary there is the San Vivaldo place of worship, the *Tuscan Jerusalem*, of great historical and artistic interest, and the city of Montaione, famous for its "green tourism", whose historical centre is of medieval origin.

TOTAL LENGTH OF THE ITINERARY: 100.0 km

LEVEL OF DIFFICULTY: average-easy

TYPE OF STREET SURFACE: The majority are asphalted, in good conditions except for some uneven road sections between lano and Villamagna

TRAVELLING TIME: only the itinerary about 2 hours and 30 minutes, stops excluded

MINIMUM ALTITUDE RANGE: 36 m above sea level

MAXIMUM ALTITUDE RANGE:: 518 m above sea level

#### **SAN MINIATO**

San Miniato is a characteristic medieval hamlet, rich in history and art. It is also famous for its wine and gastronomy products such as precious wines and white truffles. Regarding these latter, unmissable is the White Truffle Exhibition Market. which is held every November, when the city becomes a real open air market, rich in colours and perfumes. Its Sistema Museale (Museum System) is noteworthy, it is a kind of "diffused museum" whose art collections are exhibited in interesting architectonical structures, such as the Museo Diocesano (Diocesan Museum), Conservatorio di Santa Chiara (Saint Chiara Academy of Music), and the Accademia degli Euteleti, just to mention a few. Unmissable is the Rocca federiciana (the Fortress of Frederick II), which characterises the city's profile.

#### PIEVE DI CORAZZANO

Corazzano, near San Miniato, is a typical truffle area, show-piece of local gastronomy. The Parish Church dates back to 892, and was declared World Heritage by UNESCO. Open only upon request; for an internal visit contact Agenzia Entroterra Viaggi &Turismo, tel. +39 0571/417175.

#### **SAN VIVALDO**

San Vivaldo, hamlet of Montaione, is one of the most famous places of worship in Italy, recognised as national monument. Apart from the church and convent the innumerable chapels are very interesting, the oldest one dates back to 1325, they are located in the surrounding wooded area. This place is also called Small Tuscan Jerusalem, since the small churches and chapels built by the Grey Friars in that period were arranged

exactly as the sacred places of Jerusalem: the purpose was to allow the local people to make a pilgrimage without having to go to the Holy Land. The chapels aren't always open to visitors, to book a visit contact Agenzia Entroterra Viaggi & Turismo, Tel. +39 0571/417175.

#### **SANTUARIO DELLA PIETRINA**

The Santuario della Pietrina is a charming country church that rises on the remains of the ancient Pietra castle. It is possible to visit the church, the towers in ruin, a small permanent nativity, and the wine-cellar. Next to the church there is a scenic area from which it is possible to see Volterra in the distance and, if the days are particularly clear, even the sea can be seen.

#### **VOLTERRA**

Volterra is one of the most important cities of Tuscany, thanks to its artistic and cultural treasures, evidence of the civilisations that followed each other during thirty centuries of history. It is a city that maintains its ancient atmosphere, with the alleys of the medieval hamlet and trades coming from Etruscan past. In fact, Volterra is famous for the workmanship of Tuscan alabaster, whose artefacts are still one of the most typical and traditional export products of Tuscan handicraft.

#### PIEVE DELLA NERA

It is a Parish church built around the year 1000 and is dedicated to San Giovanni Battista. It was a very important centre in the ancient and large diocese of Volterra. The Parish Church is on the ancient Via Salaiola that in the Middle Ages was an important communication and commerce way, above all for salt transport.

#### **MONTAIONE**

It is a hamlet of medieval origin, in ancient times walls surrounded it; in its historical centre there is the Church of San Regolo, where it is possible to admire the painting of the "Madonna col bambino" (Madonna with Child) and the Palazzo Pretorio (Municipal Building), which has some stone and terracotta heraldic shields on the external facade.
